



PINDAN ACCOUNTING SCHOLARSHIP APPLICANT INFORMATION

The Pindan Accounting Scholarship has been developed between Pindan Ltd and Curtin University of Technology and is available to a 2nd year Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting) student. The value of this scholarship is a cash payment of \$5000 per annum for 2 years maximum and provides vacation employment. Pindan is one of Western Australia's leading multi-disciplined property and construction companies who pride themselves on personal and honest attention to detail, delivering the highest quality product to satisfied clients.

Completed application forms are required to be submitted by the applicant for assessment and students should include all accompanying documentation, either original or certified copies of originals. Applications will be deemed ineligible if the applicant fails to submit all required documentation.

The Pindan Accounting Scholarship will provide a cash payment of \$5000 to assist with costs associated with studying (textbooks, incidental expenses etc). The award of this scholarship does not preclude the recipient from holding others. Pindan Pty Ltd does reserve the right to amend the cash amount of the award if the recipient holds another scholarship. Pindan Pty Ltd also reserves the right to deem applicants ineligible for this scholarship if in receipt of another. Scholarship recipients may not defer their study and scholarship commencement.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Applicants must meet ALL of the following criteria to be considered for the Pindan Accounting Scholarship:

- Be an Australian citizen, holder of an Australian Permanent Humanitarian visa, Permanent Resident visa or a New Zealand citizen;
- Be an enrolled full time (200 credit points per year) student, undertaking their second year in the Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting) degree.
- Be eligible for a Commonwealth Supported place at the University.

AWARD CRITERIA

The Scholarship(s) will be awarded by a Selection Panel using the following criteria:

- Academic Record
- Response to questions in scholarship application form
- Interview by selection committee

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION

Documentation required for Pindan Accounting Scholarship is:

- Proof of Citizenship or visa status (Birth Certificate, Passport or Citizenship Certificate)
- Academic results for applicants Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting) course to date
- Nomination or reference from a Curtin Academic/previous employer/recognized community representative

Documents must be either original or certificated copies. Only a Justice of the Peace or a Commissioner of Declarations can certify documents. Original documents will be accepted at Student Central for copying – original documents will be returned. No other copies (including faxes) will be accepted.

PAYMENT TENURE

Once the Pindan Accounting Scholarship has been accepted, the scholarship will commence from the first semester of study of the recipients second year.

The cash component of the scholarship will be paid to the student in two instalments of \$2,500 past census date in each applicable semester. Any cash payments will be on a pro-rata basis if the applicant applies to and receives permission to under load due to exceptional circumstances.

Scholarship continuity is subject to meeting a high standard of academic progress (Course Weighted Average of at least 70.00 and pass all enrolled units). Unless there are exceptional circumstances, a recipient with unsatisfactory



progress shall be ineligible to retain a scholarship. Determination of exceptional circumstances shall be at the discretion of the Manager, Scholarships and Financial Aid Office.

ENROLMENT

Unless there are exceptional circumstances students must:

- Maintain a full time study load of 100 credits per semester
- Maintain a Course Weighted Average of at least 70.00
- Pass all units attempted

Determination of exceptional circumstances shall be at the discretion of the Manager, Scholarships and Financial Aid Office.

Where a student intends taking leave of absence during their studies, the student must apply for and seek approval from the Manager, Scholarships and Financial Aid Office to suspend the scholarship for the period of leave.

Where a student withdraws or is terminated from their course of study, they will become ineligible for continuation of the scholarship.

OTHER CONDITIONS

- The Pindan Accounting Scholarship is not transferable to another university.
- A recipient who does not re-enrol in future semesters without having applied for leave of absence will forfeit the scholarship.
- A scholarship may not be transferable to another course of study and extensions of the duration of the scholarship will only be given in extenuating circumstances. Students who change their course of study will forfeit the scholarship.
- Where a student withdraws from study prior to the census date, the student will be required to repay the cash payment awarded for that study period.
- Unless exceptional circumstances can be demonstrated, students who withdraw from studies after the census date, or who are terminated from studies, will be required to repay the cash payment awarded for the relevant semester to the University.
